

FEIYI WEN

Feiyi Wen (b. 1990) is a visual artist and researcher based in London, UK. Her practice incorporates photographic prints, written texts, book-making, printed objects, and installation. She holds a Master's degree in Photography from the Royal College of Art and received a practice-led PhD in Fine Art at the Slade School of Fine Art, University College London.

Wen's work explores the representation of landscape through a cross-cultural lens, drawing on methodologies from comparative literature and translation studies. Her research weaves together East Asian and European poetic and visual traditions to investigate how landscapes are interpreted and constructed across cultural contexts. At the heart of her practice is the notion of translation—across languages, cultural frameworks, and between the verbal and the visual.

Her image-making process places a strong emphasis on materiality and experimental printing techniques, including silver gelatin, photo-etching, risograph, and other surface-driven methods. Her engagement with historical movements such as pictorialism informs her contemporary exploration of the tactile and expressive potential of photographic media. By combining different surfaces through the layering of scans and rescans, printing and reprinting, the result is often a photograph of a photograph. In doing so, she distorts space and stretches temporal perception, reinforcing the contemplative nature of her work—while also raising questions around originality and time.

Wen's work has been exhibited internationally at institutions and festivals including Tate Britain, Photo Shanghai, the Beijing Photo Biennale, Photo London, Photo Oxford, Brighton Photo Fringe, the Aperture Gallery, Chanel Nexus Hall, and others.
